DAVID'S DIARY

Good to hear that G2 was on the track at Ruapuna recently at the Scope Classic car racing event. I haven't done anything at Ruapuna for a couple of years, but it is a great experience. I imagine that a lot of people in our club have driven on a race track sometime, but if you haven't then it is something to think about.

A lot of clubs have events where they are happy to have others join in as it helps to cover their costs for the day. They often divide drivers into categories of beginners through to experienced. There may be an opportunity for beginners to go out with an experienced driver before the days racing starts. If your'e a first timer, grab that offer.

They can show you what lines to take around corners, which is a great thing to adapt to your road driving for a more comfortable ride for your passengers.

Cornering lines is a good thing to understand. Uncle Google is all over it.

You need to make sure that your car is in good road worthy condition. There will be scrutineering early in the day where they check your car over. Some of the items they check will be:

Steering and suspension

Tyres

Battery hold down/security

Throttle return spring

Fire extinguisher bolted down within easy reach of the driver (often just tucked under the front of the passengers seat) Quite a good thing to have in your car anyway.

Full face helmet

Cotton overalls

Some events require a roll cage, but many don't.

If there is anything that is going to go wrong on your car over the next 12 months, then it may well fast forward to your time on the track.

Good to have a few tools including an accurate tyre pressure gauge as you may want to alter them on the day. Starting off with around 35 psi should be a good start.

Remove anything loose in the car as they become missiles in the car as you fly around corners.

Remove unnecessary weight, like spare wheel, Jack, tools etc.

A few people get car sick and take medication for that.

Wear the smallest, niftiest shoes you have, as your feet get quite busy at times and you need all the room you can get down there.

The excitement and adrenaline is immense as you risk life and limb so many times on a lap. People go out there to have a non competitive run, but the reality is that that all changes once you get going. You see people walking around after a few laps and their overalls are wet down their spine. You may think that they aren't doing much, but not true! It is that level of concentration which takes your mind out of everything else. A friend who was a solicitor with a very stressful job used to do this as a stress relief for him. What revs you change gears, how fast you can change gears, how effective your brakes are

What revs you change gears, how fast you can change gears, how effective your brakes are means you can brake later and achieve a better lap time. Plenty to think about. Some etiquette on the track:

If another car turns up on your tail then it is most likely faster than you, so at your earliest opportunity, keep over and let them pass.

Don't do anything that puts another car in danger. Follow all instructions on the day. Like a lot of things in life, it is all about respect. For others.
