I hope that everyone is getting on OK. Levels, lockdowns, masks, announcements, rules. Pretty weird eh?

I can't help worry though, how much debt is NZ in now? So, I looked it up.

Net debt was \$49.3 billion in 2020, up \$20.6 billion from 2019, increasing for the first time since 2016. (Stats NZ)

With all the govt. wage subsidies, I thought it may have been more, but government hand outs are a funny thing:

Each employee who receives \$600 pw subsidy, quickly learns that this is actually 'before' tax, so at 30% tax (\$48,00 to \$70,000 income pa) \$180 is paid back to the government as PAYE tax.

The employee now has \$420 pw to spend.

They go to the supermarket and very carefully spend \$160. The supermarket then pays \$20.87 to the government for GST collected on the sale.

The employee then spends \$70 on power, insurance etc.

The government has now clawed back \$210 in tax from the \$600.

The employee puts their remaining \$190 towards rent - which is exempt from GST. However the landlord will pay income tax on any profit.

So that \$420 keeps getting passed around as each person or business uses it to pay bills and buy stuff. And every time that happens, chi ching. They pass GO and pay \$200! Actually 15% in GST plus income tax.

It reminds me of when Andy Capp sold a homing pigeon, he knew that later in the day it would return to him! Bit of an old drug dealer at heart was Andy. Whoops, did I just liken the government to a drug dealer? Maybe I should just put the shovel away for today.

Further to my thoughts on EVs, fuels etc. I am still receiving interesting ideas and info from members - thank you. I need to catch up with a couple of our members yet, to get their input. It is just a discussion. I don't have all the answers. I just like to see information presented in a way that we can all give it some balanced consideration.

Without pushing it too much more this month, I will just mention that Glyn Jones sent me some info regarding Porsche beginning to develop an alternative fuel for the owners of their marque.

Porsche are setting up a synthetic methanol gasoline production plant to produce an alternative fuel to petrol. It's eFuels will "permit the almost climate-neutral operation of combustion-engine vehicles." The carmaker recently said its electrofuels could cut CO2 emissions by 85%. The fuel will burn the same as petrol made from crude oil, but without the huge greenhouse gas emissions. It can be sold at the existing network of filling stations globally and Porsche owners will not need to get their engines modified. It makes their cars cleaner than an electric vehicle when factoring in the environmental impact of EV battery production and disposal.

It is interesting that Porsche estimate that around 70% of all vehicles they have ever made, are still on the road. Sounds very sustainable.

A LOOK BACK



I was going through some old society papers and was reflecting on why CMSNZ came into being around 25 years ago.

A number of us were entering "classic car" events organised by others including one make Marque Clubs. After one event in 1994 [if my memory serves me correctly] a group of us got together to pursue the idea of establishing a not-for-profit club for people who enjoy getting out in their cars and exploring roads less travelled.

A common thought was that the important aspects of such a club were firstly that the enjoyment of getting out and exploring our country [and as it turns out Australia] was paramount and secondly that it did not matter what sort of vehicle you used. And so, the Classic MOTORING Society was born, and a constitution developed. We thought having a formal Constitution was important as it established accountability for the use of members funds. Any surpluses generated were to go back to the members by way of covering organising expenses for our major events and allowing the initial Sunday runs to be free of entry costs. We then expanded to introduce the Gold Card Cruisers mid-week runs. It was not too many years after establishment that the Nelson Marlborough sister club was established, again with aims similar to ours. Many of us are members of both Societies. Early on it was established that "concourse de-elegance" was not for us and it did not matter if your vehicle was original, modified and the age did not matter.

The important things were that we socialised and that we could bring to an event any type or model of vehicle we wanted without recriminations of them not being of standard spec, of a

certain age and condition. As long as they had a WOF we were, and still are happy. Some of us even bring two stroke SAAB's.

As they develop I am sure we will see more Hybrids, Phev's and EV's.

It has been fun thinking back on some of the adventures we have had over the last 25 years. The successes, the breakdowns, the fancy-dress nights, the friends we have made and the amount of country we have covered in our CLASSIC MOTORING.

Somebody asked why I had 007 as a number on the major tours, so I hasten to add that there are no pretentious thoughts to be likened to James Bond.

As one of the original twelve my membership number was and is 007


